TORCA had an incredibly busy year in 2022! Last year we were successful in the biggest grant application in TORCA's history, and this year saw us work hard to deliver on those projects and spend that money. The Covid Recovery Grant was used in its entirety this year to complete the Spring Creek Expansion project – this resulted in opening a number of new trails and upgrading existing trails.

During the 2022 season, TORCA was able to spend \$190,000 on trail upgrades and construction! We also ran the Canada Summer Jobs Program for the second season in a row and received over \$23,000 in funding.

Thanks to all of you we had our best membership, merchandise and coaching year yet! We generated almost \$15,000 in membership revenue! Thank you to each of you who bought memberships, merchandise or lessons through our certified coaches.

Very little in the way of monetary expenses go into administration for TORCA due to generous donations from our board members, community members and volunteers. Without these amazing contributions, our administrative costs would be much higher and we would have considerably less money to put directly into our trails. Thanks again to all of these wonderful humans and organizations who make it possible for us to operate the way we do and maximize the dollars that go into our trails.

#### President & Directors Reports

#### President's Report - Tyler Wilkes' report read by Aleksa Havelaar

"[...] The TORCA Board worked hard this year to try to get things as back to normal as possible. This included re-starting Dirt Club, providing coaching services, and doing some community outreach events. We had some huge wins this year with the completion of the Spring Creek Expansion project, full suite of in-person events, coaching/clinics in full swing, and amazing trail maintenance through dirt club and a grant-funded youth trail crew. The directors will present details on all of these shortly!

Our membership hit record numbers we more than doubled Grom (11 and under) memberships this year, and we increased the number of donors and sponsors. [...] It signals to us that mountain biking is a core value in our community on several levels. [...] It is an economic driver that supports livelihoods in our community. It is a critical tool for attraction and retention of residents in our community. And it is a tourism draw that bring visitors to the region. These positive impacts are being recognized by stakeholders, government and community members, and the momentum is greater than ever. And it's all thanks to the hard work of the TORCA board, members, sponsors, land management partners, and supporting community members that make our mountain bike community what it is today.

[...] I'd like to thank our incredible members and sponsors/donors this year – without you the things we do would not be possible. The funding, in-kind donations, prizes, etc. that we receive make this organization

what it is [...] help us put on the events and programs we run and help fund the maintenance and construction of the trails we all love and use. [...] Please do your best to support these amazing local businesses.

#### Spring Creek Trail Project:

- Project was fully completed on time and on budget using the provincial CERIP grant which was awarded in 2021. Project value was \$270,000 plus volunteer time to project manage, grant reporting, financial reporting, site inspections, contract administration, etc. (estimated \$30k volunteer time value)
- The project was professionally designed by McElhanney and professional trail building contractors (Noble 5) were retained for both phases of the project through a competitive bid process.
- Project includes:
  - o [...] Terradise
  - o Billey GOAT trails within the Hey Bear loop − 1 climb, 1 black/1 blue downhill. Black trail will open in the spring when some of the berms dry up.
- Bear Back
- o Upgrades to Spring Creek to make it more climb-preferred
- o Benefits of the project include:
  - Increased connectivity of the network
  - Multiple new loop options
  - Separation of up/down traffic
  - Jumps and berms
  - Progressive challenge level of new trails that are short and accessible from Hey Bear to allow beginners to progress their skill level before moving onto bigger rides".

- Trail days Corporate team building activity trail maintenance
- Youth trail crew; 15 to 30 years old. federal gov program, helped by local sponsors. worked on Steinhoe, Flathead, tidying the new trails, etc. Hoping to get the program back next year, and some sponsors have already exp
- Trails were in good shape, no major weather event. The most problematic days are coming with the frost-eve (shoulder season)....

#### **Coaching**

We formally launched the program this year. All our instructors are local and are certified level 1, by the PMBIA.

This year the program offered trail-based lessons, (to 13 y.old and up, TORCA members):

- individual; 2-3 hours customized coaching sessions (up to 4 person).
- organized group; like the "2 weeks progression sessions" and the Intl women mountain bike day.

Next year we will build on what was successful and get started on coaching on our new trails with jumps & berms! We are hoping to get some instructors certified level 2, and coaching on black trails.

All the funds raised from the coaching program goes back to trails (revenues after expenses).

#### **Membership**

Membership this year was greater than ever before. The money from membership is going back to support our trail network, it helps us show support for our grant's applications and, also demonstrate demand for our demands of fundings for new trails.

It allows members to participate in events and gives voting rights at the AGM.
